the students for their eager participation and the technology team, for being the backbone of the entire programme.









. INTER HOUSE ART COMPETITION 2020 "You don't take a photograph, you make it."

The event was graced by the presence of the esteemed judges, Ms Manmeet Kaur, Ms Neha Singh, alumnae of our school and Ms Gurleen Kaur, the English faculty at JKPS.
